SPECIAL EDUCATION ASSISTANTS REQUIRED

The Holy Spirit Catholic Board of Education requires the following special education assistants to commence as soon as possible:

- **Our Lady of Assumption School** requires a 3 hour, 4 days per week, special education assistant to work with a grade 5 student with Cerebral Palsy. This position requires someone who has the ability to implement a daily regimen for the student including the use of adaptive equipment and exercises prescribed by the Occupational and Physical therapists. The successful candidate will be physically able to provide direct monitoring and assistance to students during class and recess. *Please quote # 2009 09 15*
- **Children of St. Martha School** requires a 30 hour per week special education assistant to work with a grade 1 student with speech and language delays. This position requires someone with experience and training with speech and language techniques as well as behaviour modification techniques. *Please quote #2009 09 16*
- **St. Paul School** requires a 30 hour per week special education assistant in the LIFE program. The successful candidate must be able to assist in delivering individual programs to 21 students with severe special needs including FASD, Autism, Oppositional Defiant Disorder, deafness and ADHD. This position will involve personal care, lifting and supervision of children with multiple needs. The successful candidate must have the physical mobility to actively engage students in class and at recess. *Please quote #2009 09 17*
- **St. Paul School** requires a 30 hour per week special education assistant to work with a non verbal autistic student. This position will involve personal care, lifting and the supervision of children with multiple needs. The successful candidate will have training and experience in Applied Behavioural Analysis and behaviour management. *Please quote #2009 09 18.*
- **Ecole St. Mary School** requires a 30 hour per week special education assistant to work with a student with Cerebral Palsy. This position requires someone who has the ability to implement a daily regimen for the student including the use of adaptive equipment and exercises prescribed by the Occupational and Physical therapists. The successful candidate will be physically able to actively engage students in class and at recess. *Please quote # 2009 09 19.*
