PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Background

The reporting of student progress and growth is a process of two-way communication between the school and the home. In order to best serve the needs of the student, parent-teacher interviews will be held whenever requested by the parent or teacher.

Procedures

- 1. Each school may use up to the equivalent of three full school days per year for parent-teacher interviews.
- 2. Principals may break up the one or two-day time interval as required.
- 3. Interviews should be held for all parents, and a time schedule should be set up.
- 4. Invitations should be sent to parents. Principals are encouraged to arrange appointments for parents.
- 5. Principals and teachers should attempt some in-service for parents and teachers to try to make the interviews more effective.
- 6. Teachers should attempt follow-up procedures after interviews are held to try to remedy problems and issues that have been identified.
