EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF 2022 THOUGHTEXCHANGE:

"How might we continue to positively impact student learning and improve our educational results?"

Background

A ThoughtExchange survey was launched from March 28 until April 11, 2022. Based on the Holy Spirit Catholic School Division's current <u>Board Strategic Priorities</u> and <u>Annual Education Results Report</u>, parents/guardians, staff, and community members were asked for their feedback in determining: "How might we continue to positively impact student learning and improve our educational results?"

Additional context regarding the current political climate bears some consideration in reviewing the results received through the ThoughtExchange Survey.

The Continued Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic

In March 2020, the COVID-19 Pandemic forced staff and students alike to pivot to an online forum. When classes resumed in September 2020, Alberta Health Services worked diligently with the school division to mitigate the spread of the disease by moving classes to at-home learning when there was evidence of exposure to the disease. Contact tracing efforts and the continual movement of classes between in-person and online forums diminished in January 2022. Nonetheless, the continual interruptions and changes in learning mechanisms during this time unquestionably challenged and strained both staff and students alike, who all endeavored to maintain high quality regardless of the situation. Currently, fatigue and resultant gaps in learning remain challenges that will require attention well into the future. As a result, several respondents identified "Mental Health" for both staff and students as a definite area of need.

Alberta's DRAFT Curriculum

The survey's most highly rated thoughts relate to the current controversial efforts of Alberta Education to draft and release a new curriculum. The responses provided are overwhelmingly opposed to the current draft and its implementation, which aligns with the "K-6 DRAFT Curriculum Survey" feedback the Board received from parents/guardians, staff, and community members in October 2021. Managing Limited Resources

Concern about diminishing budgets and resources was a topic reiterated in several categories of this survey. Many comments imbued the importance of ensuring that educational resources be focused towards the classroom and front lines staff members, who are essential to ensuring high quality education for students.

Survey Demographics

A total of 411 individuals from across the division participated in the ThoughtExchange. Of those, 171 provided 272 thoughts and 217 rated and ranked those thoughts using a total of 9,526 stars.
