## LOCALLY DEVELOPED COURSES

## **Background**

Board Policy 1: Board Mandate, Mission, Vision, Values and Goals identifies the mandate of the Board as providing students with a complete offering of learning opportunities, and accessing Locally Develop Courses is a tangible way the Board fulfills this responsibility. School authorities have the flexibility to develop or acquire locally developed courses to address particular student and / or community needs. These learning opportunities complement, extend and / or expand upon provincial programs of study.

## **Procedures**

- Locally developed / acquired and authorized junior and senior high school complementary courses are governed by Alberta Education Policy. School authorities must approve locally developed courses by a resolution or a motion of the Board of the school authority prior to offering the locally developed courses.
- 2. High school courses developed at the local level require Ministry approval and must be submitted by the deadlines communicated by Alberta Education. Course submissions to the Ministry shall include:
  - 2.1 Philosophy and rationale.
  - 2.2 Learning outcomes.
  - 2.3 Specific content outline.
  - 2.4 Implementation plan:
    - 2.4.1 Special facilities required
    - 2.4.2 Identification of and proposed treatment of controversial course components
    - 2.4.3 Degree to which the course complements, but avoids overlap with, provincially developed courses.
    - 2.4.4 Plan for assessing student achievement.
    - 2.4.5 Plan for course evaluation, monitoring and revision.
- 3. The objectives of courses being developed shall be consistent with the curriculum goals established for the division.
- 4. The resources required for the development and implementation of new courses shall be determined by each site administrator.

- 5. Prior to development, a study will be conducted to ensure that:
  - 5.1 A proposed course will be chosen by a reasonable number of students.
  - 5.2 Materials for implementation of the program are accessible.
  - 5.3 Teachers are available to deliver the course.
- 6. All divisional sponsored locally developed courses become the property of the division and the division retains copyright for these materials.
- 7. School authorities shall approve locally developed courses by a resolution or a motion of the Board of the school authority and in accordance with Alberta Education Policy.
- 8. Religious Education:
  - 8.1 The division, in collaboration with the Bishop of the Diocese of Calgary, determines the resources for use in Religious Education. The Bishop, in consultation with division leadership, parents / legal guardians and teachers mandates the Religious Education curriculum, including the human sexuality component.
  - 8.2 All other resources must be approved by the Director of Religious Education.
